## UK FOCUS FOR BIOMEDICAL ENGINEERING

The UK Focus for Biomedical Engineering was established in 1993 under the auspices of The Royal Academy of Engineering. Its origins date back to 1987 when The Academy, then known as The Fellowship of Engineering, was invited to submit evidence to the House of Lords Science and Technology Committee inquiry into priorities in medical research. This led to the formation of a working party to investigate the role of engineering in medicine and launched The Academy's involvement in the field. The working party concluded that a focus for biomedical engineering in the UK was necessary to assist developments in policy and to co-ordinate activities and so the UK Focus for Biomedical Engineering came into being.

Membership comprises a range of professional groups involved in the field, including the Institute of Physics and Engineering in Medicine, the Institutions of Mechanical, Electrical and Chemical Engineers, the Institute of Materials, the Departments of Health and Trade and Industry, the Engineering and Physical Sciences, Particle Physics and Astronomy, Biotechnology and Biological Sciences and Medical Research Councils, the Central Laboratory of the Research Councils, medical charities and the Association of British Healthcare Industries. The Royal Academy of Engineering provides a number of representatives, including the Chairman, Professor Peter Wells FREng FRS.
